## MHEs Not Covered





- Self-referrals
- Family Advocacy Program
- Drug / alcohol rehab programs
- Responsibility and competency inquiries (Rule 706 of the Manual for Courts-Martial)
- Diagnostic referral by non-mental healthcare providers
  - SM consents
- Required for service regulation without discretionary authority by the SM's Commander

# Types of MHEs





- Non-emergency (routine)
- Emergency
  - Threatening words or actions that suggest imminent violent behavior
  - To delay a MHE to complete administrative requirements would further endanger SM or victims

# Authority to Perform MHE





- Psychiatrists, Clinical Psychologists, or Social Workers certified and designated on orders
- Commander may refer SM to physician or to senior privileged non-MD provider pending evaluation by a privileged doctoral-level Medical Health Care Professional

### Voluntary vs. Involuntary Hospitalization





#### Voluntary admission:

- Provider determines what is clinically indicated
- SM has capacity to make informed decision and voluntarily consents

#### • Involuntary admission:

 Provider makes judgment that level of care cannot be less restrictive

# Service Member Rights





- Have <u>at least two days (except in</u> <u>emergencies)</u> to consult with an IG, attorney, chaplain, or other
- Seek second opinion (own expense)
- No restrictions on communication with Member of Congress, IG, or others
- Reasons for not complying with above rights
