Soldiers E4 or below will be advanced to SGT

MUTA 5 for a SGT is approximately \$500





- As an SMP, Tuition and Fee Waiver to any state school or Community College in Massachusetts
- Ability to make it work through ANY school
- Scholarships available
- Learn to be an officer on campus while you get your degree





- Four year curriculum that consists of a 2 year Basic Course and a 2 year Advanced course.
- Credit is awarded for completing Basic and AIT, ROTC Basic Camp, Military Science I/II.
- Guard members are eligible to enter the ROTC Advanced
 Course. They would have to enter ROTC in their Junior year.





- Who is eligible
- -Contracted ROTC Cadets (non scholarship) (Doesn't matter what state they are from)
- -Guarantee Reserve Force Duty (GRFD) Scholarship Cadets
- Who is ineligible
- -Cadets with a "line" scholarship. (All ROTC scholarships other than GRFD)
- Shadow a lieutenant at a local unit developing leadership skills during a drill weekend

ROTC INCENTIVES



- ARMY ROTC 2 year Reserve Forces Duty Scholarship
- Army ROTC 2 year Dedicated ARNG Scholarship (must serve 8 year Mandatory Service Obligation on NG)
- Army ROTC 3 year Dedicated ARNG Scholarship (same as above)
- MGIB + Kicker payments (36 months)
- Federal Tuition Assistance (per year)
- Tuition and Fee Waiver
- NGB and MA ARNG require cadets to sign GFRD contract before receiving Financial assistance

ROTC REQUIREMENTS



- Must be attending a college or university
- At least a 2.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- U.S. citizen to commission
- Chapter 2 Commissioning Physical within 1 year
- Pass the APFT (No profiles nor alternate aerobic)
- Meet HT/WT (Marginal tape test not acceptable)
- Minimum age of 18 and Maximum age 42 at commissioning
- Ability to obtain a Secret Clearance (Police Check)
