MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- Be a US Citizen (may be naturalized)
- 90 College Credits prior to enrollment
- GT Score 110 or Higher (may retake ASVAB)
- Chapter 2 Commissioning Physical within 2 years
- Pass the APFT (No profiles nor alternate aerobic)
- Meet HT/WT

- Minimum age of 18 and Maximum age 42 at commissioning
- 09S not to have reached age 35 at time of enlistment
- Ability to obtain a Secret Clearance
- MUST GET HEAVY ON OPAT

Traditional (State) OCS

- 16-18 months
- Once per year
- Joint Base Cape Cod, MA for drill
- AT Locations vary year to year

Accelerated OCS

- 57 days total
- 2 times a year (Winter and Summer)
- Joint Base Cape Cod, MA for drill
- AT Locations vary year to year
- ONLY FOR HIGHLY QUALIFIED APPLICANTS

PHASE 0

-
- Four MUTA 5 drills at JBCC, MA
- APFT, Land NAV, Drill and Ceremony

PHASE 1

- Annual Training ~ 14 days, location varies
- Land Navigation, Leadership Fundamentals, FLX 1, Troop Leading Procedures

PHASE 2

- Twelve MUTA 5 drills
- Classroom instruction and testing

PHASE 3

- Annual Training ~ 14 days, location varies
- Squad and Platoon level training, Obstacle Course, Combat Water Survival Training, Leadership Reaction Course, FLX 2 and 3

ACCELERATED OCS

PHASE 0

• 1-2 IDTs before ship to OCS

PHASE 1

- ~15 days
- Basic Leadership, Teamwork and Time Management Skills, Land Navigation, and Training at the Platoon Level

PHASE 2

- ~28 days
- Training focuses on the individual, squad and platoon levels. Soldiers strive for tactical and small unit leadership skills and confidence

PHASE 3

- ~14 days
- Field Leadership Exercise (FLX) II and III, Officer Candidates are evaluated on demonstrated leadership skills, attitudes, and knowledge in a tactical field environment.

- Can I apply to OCS now?: YES (IF YOU QUALIFY)
- If I don't apply for OCS now, can I apply at a later time?: YES (IF YOU QUALIFY)
- If I have SLRP and I commission, do I lose it?: NO!
- If I have a bonus and go to OCS, will I lose it? YES (without recoupment)
- Do I need to be in a certain MOS in order to get the branch I want?: NO!
- Can I commission into the Special Forces? NO
- Can I commission as a Cyber Officer? YES*
- Can my unit deny me to go to OCS: YES, BUT VERY RARE! !!
